



**What the map shows**

The dark shaded land areas are recommended to be evacuated prior to a hurricane due to potential surge flooding from hurricanes of "worst-case" meteorological conditions. Inland areas that may be exposed to freshwater flooding only are not included within evacuation zones.

- Evacuation Area A:** Flooding by all Cat. 1 and 2 storms and Cat. 3 storms traveling less than 20 mph.
- Evacuation Area B:** Flooding by Cat. 3 storms traveling faster than 20 mph and all Cat. 4 storms.
- Evacuation Area C:** Potential evacuation area represents land afforded protection by the Fox Point Hurricane Barrier. The area depicted is the potential evacuation area for a worst-case storm scenario should a malfunction of the barrier occur.
- + Hurricane-approved shelter
- ! Dam with flood potential to cause extensive property damage or even fatalities
- ➔ Evacuation route

NOTE: Hurricane categories 1 through 4 refer to the Saffir-Simpson scale of hurricane intensity. No scenarios were prepared for Category 5 hurricanes, because it is believed these storms can't survive in colder, northern waters.
