
YOUR ROLE AS A RESIDENT, PROPERTY OWNER AND BUSINESS

Property owners are required to remove snow and ice from sidewalks, catch basins, fire hydrants and pedestrian ramps adjacent to their property.

Observe parking bans. This enables city crews to salt and plow the roads quickly and safely. Once the parking ban has been lifted residents may resume parking in their designated permitted areas.

It may be necessary to suspend garbage and recycling collection in some or all parts of the City. If this occurs, crews will attempt to make the collection the following collection day or as soon as possible.

HOW WE PLOW

The Providence Public Works Department is responsible for clearing snow and ice on more than 421 miles of City maintained roads in Providence. City crews salt and plow roads in the following order of priority:

1. Main streets and arteries, bus routes and roads that provide access to fire stations and hospitals
2. Collector streets and routes leading to schools
3. Once conditions have stabilized on first- and second-priority routes, crews will begin to clear local streets

Providence crews work around the clock until all the roads are safe and drivable.

SNOW READY TIPS

PREPARE FOR AN EMERGENCY. Keep an emergency kit and supplies in your home, office and car.

KEEP A SHOVEL AND SUPPLY OF SALT handy for sidewalks and driveways.
